Dr. Wright is Chief Health Equity Officer of the 13-hospital University of Maryland Medical System. He maintains appointments as adjunct professor of emergency medicine and health policy at the George Washington University, and is professor of health policy and management at the University of Maryland School of Public Health. Dr. Wright provides national

leadership and human service entities including the Association of American Medical Colleges and the March of Dimes. He previously served as an Obama administration appointee to the Pediatric Advisory Committee of the Food and Drug Administration, and has recently been appointed to the National Academy of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine study committee on Addressing the Long-Term Impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic on Children and Families.
