MDAAP/HCHD COVID-19 Grants Program - Applications due Monday, January 17, 2022: The Maryland Chapter, American Academy of Pediatrics, with support from the Howard County Health Department, is offering grants to primary health care providers serving children living in Howard County, Maryland. Eligible practices include those comprised of primary care pediatricians, family practice physicians, and nurse practitioners located in Howard County, as well as those who can document that they serve 1,000 or more children who reside in Howard County. For multi-provider practices, grants will be awarded to the practice, not the individual providers.

These grants will fund two categories of activities:

*Category 1: Deliver COVID-19 Vaccination at the Practice: Applicants in this category must be <u>registered</u> with the State's ImmuNet program specifically to become a COVID-19 vaccine administrator. The proposed funding should be used to augment existing clinical infrastructure in order to accommodate for the administration of COVID-19 vaccination. Proposals in this category shall not exceed \$60,000.

*Category 2: Outreach and Prevention: Applications in this category shall (1) Propose activities to educate and promote the benefits and efficacy of COVID-19 vaccination in a culturally and linguistically appropriate manner; and (2) Propose activities to educate and promote the prevention of COVID-19 through documented proven strategies of mask wearing, handwashing, and social distancing that are culturally and linguistically appropriate. This can include hosting community events that provide education as well as vaccination and developing social media ads for your practice or videos to be used at Howard County sites. Proposals in this category shall not exceed \$60,000 if vaccination events are offered.
